Founded in 1949, the Hanoi University of Industrial Fine Art provides an education in industrial design and related fields, including Industrial Design, Fashion Design, Graphic Design, Interior Decoration, and Game Design. We expect that our partnership will provide the training to improve the standard of education to the benefit of both lecturers and students alike."
