DTU Introduces Students to Three Thousand Jobs

On June 3, DTU partnered with the Nguoi Lao Dong newspaper to hold a job fair to introduce graduating students to large local companies.

Ninety-two large companies and government agencies from Danang and central Vietnam were there to recruit students for 3,152 jobs in Economics, Hospitality, Foreign Language and Technology. Fifteen hundred new DTU graduates attended with another ten thousand from other local universities and colleges.

In this era of accelerating national industrialization, modernization and international integration, qualified human resources are essential to achieve the successful development of Vietnam. Dr. Nguyen Huu Phu, DTU Vice-Provost, stated that the annual Job Fair offers the opportunity for graduates to find careers appropriate to their abilities and interests, allowing companies to recruit highly qualified employees. "The program is really important for DTU, local businesses, and, in particular, for graduates. It aims to bring education and employers closer to each other and emphasizes the concern that our university has for the future of our students," said Dr. Phu.
