During the program, the startup experts assisted the top 10 project members in identifying appropriate customer segments, conducting market analyses for each specific project, defining target customers, developing competitive strategies, and creating effective business models. Additionally, the mentors coached the teams on engaging presentation skills, effective message delivery, and persuasion tactics for the competition's final round.

Pham Thi Khanh Van, a member of the SWD Company team with the project "Smartwatch with integrated remote electrical device control," shared: "After participating in the one-on-one mentoring program for the Top 10 projects of the DTU Start-Up 2024, my team members and I had the opportunity to listen to and learn from valuable experience for our entrepreneurial activities. Among these, the

knowledge about accurately calculating business metrics was novel and useful. Additionally, many comments and suggestions from the mentors helped us better refine our project with more practical ideas."
